ORIFLAME'S SO FEVER HER

Part of a duo that includes a cologne for men called So Fever Him (we did not try that one out, so we can't tell you what we thought of it) and a female counterpart called So Fever Her, Oriflame's new perfume doesn't score well on our list of appealing names. Its target audience is a slightly older one, but the name is a little too cheesy for the mature audience that it's aimed at. Of course, perfumes can have the strangest names, so maybe this will catch on too. If Dior's Hypnotic Poison and Henrik Vibskov's Solar Donkey Power (that's right; we really aren't kidding) do so well, this should have no problems.

It comes in a bright red box – not my favourite. However, the bottle is well-designed, it's curvy twists and turns make it easy to hold, spray and store, and it looks good too.

When it comes to its scent, however, it was going to be a hit or miss. With ginger root flowers and notes of sandalwood, oriental scents and a little hint of vanilla thrown in, it's one of those heady, musky scents (even without an obvious addition of musk) that sits well on my skin. It's not even slightly sweet, which is one of the most important things for me. But, even with its heady scent it's not too heavy – it has a freshness to it that makes it easy to wear through the day as well as on a night out.

It claims to have aphrodisiac properties, but I can't say that I tested those out enough to vouch for them! It is a fan favourite though, which is something you can tell when you're asked what perfume you have on – twice on one occasion.

Would I recommend the perfume? At its price and the way it smells, definitely. However, it doesn't linger as long as you'd expect it to, so you may need to re-spray through the day.
